Visitors can plan a trip by searching for a park by GPS location or activity including hiking, camping, boating, birding and more. Once in the park, GPS and GIS mapping technology will allow you to track and record trails, mark waypoints, locate your friends within the parks and enjoy GeoChallenge activities and games. ## David Crockett State Park

was dedicated in 1959, in honor of one of Tennessee's most famous native sons. It is a 1,100-acre state park where whitetail deer and wild turkeys can be easily viewed as you drive through the park.

### Historical Significance

David Crockett - pioneer, soldier, politician, industrialist, legislator, statesman, patriot and hero established a diversified industry consisting of a powder mill, gristmill and a distillery along the banks of Shoal Creek in what is now his namesake park. All three operations were washed away in a flood in 1821. Crockett died at the Alamo in 1836, while aiding the Texans in their fight for independence from Mexico.

### Cabins

The park features seven new LEED Certified, premium cabins with two bedrooms, two baths and a full kitchen. One bedroom has two queen beds, the master has a queen-size bed and the great room has a queen sleeper sofa. Each cabin is completely furnished and offers a covered patio. These unique modern accommodations are energy efficient and environmentally responsible. The cabins are rented year-round with a two-night minimum from Labor Day until Memorial Day and a six-night minimum from Memorial Day until Labor Day. Make your reservations by calling 931-762-9408.

### Restaurant

The restaurant seats up to 240 people and has wonderful views of Lindsay Lake. The restaurant is open year-round. For meeting room reservation and catering call 931-762-9541.

### Meeting Rooms

There are two meeting rooms available by reservation. The restaurant offers catering to groups of up to 250 persons.

### Camping

The park has two campgrounds with a total of 107 sites designated for campers. Campground 1 is near the entrance of the park with Shoal Creek passing along its boundaries and has 54 sites. Campground 2 is a mile into the park. Each campground has water and electricity hookups, bathhouses and a sewage disposal station.

### Fishing

Fishing is allowed year round at Lindsay Lake. Bait and a Tennessee fishing license can be obtained from vendors near the park.

### Picnic Pavilions

There are seven picnic pavilions available to reserve for parties, company picnics or family reunions. The pavilions accommodate from 30 to 100 people. To reserve, call 931-762-9408.

### Boating

Fishing boats can be rented at the lake during the summer season and at the office during off-season. Paddleboats are also offered during the summer.

### Hiking

There are over nine miles of natural and paved hiking trails ranging from easy to moderate. Maps of trails can be obtained from the park office.

### Group Camp

David Crockett offers a Scout Camp that accommodates approximately 30 tent sites. Reservations must be made by calling the park office at 931-762-9408.

### Amphitheater

The amphitheater seats about 1,000 people and is available by reservation.

### Visitor Center and Museum


The park museum, built to resemble a gristmill, is open to the public free of charge from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Interpretive programs are offered during the summer and special arrangements can be made by calling the park office at 931-762-9408.

### Bike Trails

The bike trail is 2.3 miles and is paved. No bike rentals are available.

### Swimming

The park has an Olympic-size swimming pool and a children's wading pool. The pool is open early summer until early August.
