



Marina/Boating/Fishing

Located on mile marker 66.1 on Kentucky Lake is the Paris Landing full-service marina, with gas, diesel fuel and a self-serve pump out station. The marina has annual and transient slips and a three lane public boat launch ramp. The ramp will accommodate wave runners and boats up to 72 feet. A day-use courtesy dock is available at the inn for guests. Shuttle service is available from the marina to the inn and cabins for overnight guests. Fishing is productive from the bank and fishing piers, but the best way to experience this large reservoir is by boat. Personal small boats may be carried through the park and launched from the shoreline for use in small coves. The marina store sells fishing licenses, bait, ice and other boating needs. Contact the harbormaster on channel 16 or by phone 731-641-4474 for information.

Swimming

The park has an Olympic-size public swimming pool with lifeguards on duty. There is also a wading pool for children. The pool is open from Memorial Day to the first week of August. There is also a public swimming area on the Kentucky Lake shore.

Amphitheater

The annual Summer in the Park concert series is every Saturday night from May to July. Listen to the sounds of bluegrass, gospel, and country as the sunsets over Kentucky Lake.

Planned Programs

An interpretive raptor program is offered on Friday night in the hotel lobby (April-Oct.) with an opportunity to view different birds of prey. Our seasonal interpretive ranger offers activities every weekend throughout the summer. A seasonal interpretive ranger is also available to assist large groups with planning recreational activities.





Paris Landing State Park

This 1,095-acre park is located on the western shore of the Tennessee River which is dammed to form Kentucky Lake (160,000 acres). The park sits on the widest part of the lake (three miles wide) and is the perfect location for all water sports such as fishing, boating, swimming and skiing. On land, there is plenty of activity with golfing, hiking, camping or just relaxing and enjoying the natural beauty and wildlife. Be on the lookout for deer, turkey, fox and coyote which roam the park. Eagles are often seen in the winter months.

Historical Significance

Paris Landing State Park was named after an old steamboat and freight landing on the Tennessee River. In the 1800s, the river landing was an important spot for the delivery of goods to serve the settlements of the region and an important shipping point for produce and other agricultural products. The site has long afforded good access along the river, and became a state park in 1945.

Cabins

The park features 10 three-bedroom, two-bath standard cabins, each furnished to sleep up to 10 people. Cabins are fully equipped for housekeeping with linens, cooking and serving utensils, appliances, microwave, gas-log fireplace, telephone and cable TV. Cabins have a minimum two-night stay requirement, except during the summer when they are rented weekly. Pets are allowed with a charge per pet per night.

Hiking

The parks' self-guided trail system is four miles long and consists of three trails ranging from easy to moderate. If that's not enough, over 100 miles of trail are nearby at Land Between the Lakes.

Inn

The Paris Landing Inn has 130 guestrooms with balconies that provide a commanding view of Kentucky Lake. All rooms have full baths, cable TV, hair dryers, iron, ironing board and coffeemakers. One and two-bedroom suites are available with microwaves, mini-fridges, and sitting areas. The Inn also features an outdoor swimming pool, fitness room and gift shop with local treasures. Restaurant

The Rverboat Restaurant seats 250 people and overlooks picturesque Kentucky Lake. The restaurant is noted for its excellent buffet which features Southern cuisine in a casual atmosphere. All conferences, meetings and banquets are catered by the restaurant, making it easy to plan your next function.

Conference Center and Meeting Rooms

The Conference Center offers more than 10,000 square feet of meeting/banquet space in three conference rooms, which will accommodate up to 1000 people. There are also five meeting rooms at the Inn with an additional 5000 square feet of meeting/banquet space. The rose garden, adjacent to the Inn is a picturesque setting for weddings. Our professional group sales staff can assist with all of your planning needs. Paris Landing is an ideal location for your next meeting, conference, reunion or retreat.

Camping

The campground offers 45 sites with water and electric (30 amp), and 18 primitive campsites. There are two bathhouses and a dump station open March through November. Campsites can accommodate RV's up to 38 feet in length. All pets must be kept on a leash. There is a launderette available. Camping is open year round by reservation. Make your reservation by calling the park or reserve online.



Golf

Paris Landing State Park Golf Course is situated on the western shore of Kentucky Lake. The entire course is tree-lined, creating a feeling that you are the only one on the course, very rarely seeing another foursome. Several holes skirt the Kentucky Lake, producing a natural balance of rolling land, trees, and water. The park pro shop provides golfing supplies, lessons, rental clubs and carts. Golf packages are available. The pro shop snack bar is open (March-October) for breakfast and lunch.
