HIKING

Over eight miles of hiking trails, easy to moderate, are available. Trail maps may be obtained at the park office.

GIFT SHOP

T-shirts, caps, coffee mugs and hiking sticks are a few of the items available at the gift shop in the park office.

PICNIC PAVILIONS

Chickasaw has three picnic shelters/pavilions that may be reserved for an event or gathering. Depending on the shelter, the maximum capacity ranges from 32 to 50 people. The shelters are equipped with picnic tables, a grill and access to restrooms.

HORSEBACK RIDING

Chickasaw State Park has five miles of horse trail and the surrounding Chickasaw Forest has hundreds of miles of trail. Horses may be rented at the stables or bring your own.

WRANGLER CAMP

The wrangler campground has 32 sites with water and electric hookups. There are posts at each site to picket your horses, and stalls may be rented at the stables.



FISHING

Lake Placid provides catches of bass, bream and catfish. Fishing boats may be rented year-round from the boathouse or park. Paddleboats, canoes, kayaks, and paddleboards are available for daily rental, seasonally. Private boats are not allowed on Lake Placid, with the exception of canoes and kayaks.

SWIMMING

The park's picturesque swim beach is open April to October, from 8 A.M. until sunset. Swimming is free of charge. There are no lifeguards on duty and swimming is at your own risk.

BIKING

Bicycles are allowed on park roads and cyclists may access miles of additional roads in the adjacent Chickasaw State Forest.

PLANNED PROGRAMS

Games, arts and crafts, campfire programs and guided hikes are available in the summer months.
