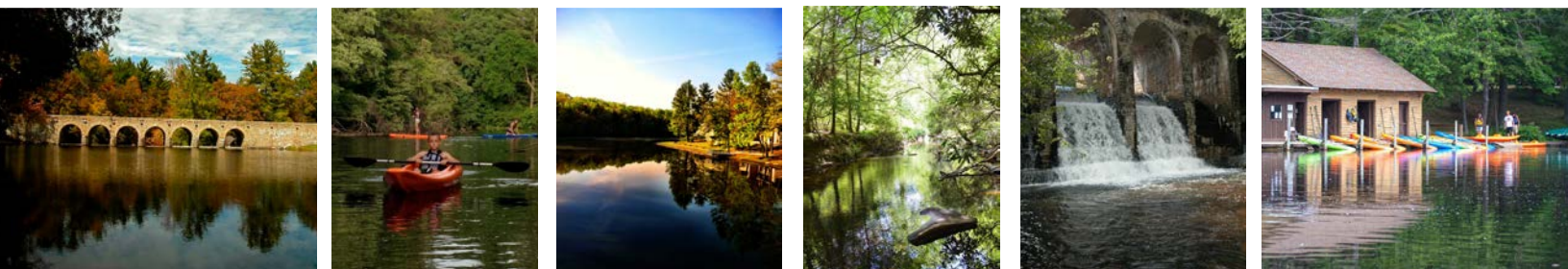




CUMBERLAND MOUNTAIN STATE PARK

PARK DESCRIPTION

Cumberland Mountain State Park is situated on the Cumberland Plateau, a segment of the great upland, which extends from western New York to central Alabama. It is said to be the largest timbered plateau in America. Cumberland Mountain State Park began as part of the greater Cumberland Homesteads Project, a New Deal-era initiative by the Resettlement Administration that helped relocate poverty-stricken families on the Cumberland Plateau to small farms centered on what is now the Cumberland Homestead community. This 1,720-acre park was acquired in 1938 to provide a recreational area for some 250 families selected to homestead on the Cumberland Plateau.

HOSTING DESCRIPTION

Campground Description

Cumberland Mountain State Park has Five Camping Areas

Campgrounds are located off the first right from the main park entrance road, Hwy 419. All five camping areas are near each other.

Area 1: 28 All wooded camp area (Host on #22)

Area 2: 32 Mixed wooded-open sites (Host on #38)

Area 3: 31 Mixed wooded-open sites (Host on #74)

Area 4: 22 All wooded sites (Maintenance Host on #103, Host on #113)

Area 5: 31 Mostly wooded sites (Host on #132)

Host Site Description

Schedule: Year-Round

All host campsites have water, electric 30, 50 amp service and sewer.

Each site is back-in only, and is equipped with a charcoal grill, fire ring, lantern hanger, and picnic table. Wi-Fi is available.

Each area has one bathhouse with hot showers, and accessible restrooms. Area 4 is NOT handicap accessible. A dump station is near the Camp Store.

Responsibilities

- Cleaning bathhouses
- Picking up trash in your area and throughout the park
- Blowing debris off campsites with leaf blower
- Putting reservation tags out on campsites daily
- Meet and greet guests
- Report any major issues to the park ranger on duty
- * Any other jobs needed per the Park Manager/Park Ranger
