PARK DESCRIPTION

Panther Creek State Park is a 1,444 acre park located on the Cherokee Reservoir in the historic Holston River Valley, six miles west of Morristown. Pioneers from North Carolina and the older Watauga Settlement in East Tennessee arrived in this area around 1785. Prior to this time, the Cherokee Indians were the most prominent Native American tribe in the area.

HOSTING DESCRIPTION

Campground Description

RV Campground

The park's 50-site campground is situated around a one-way paved loop road located approximately 0.7-tenths of a mile from the main park entrance. The campground is situated on a gently sloping hillside and is surrounded by dense woods with Panther Creek within a short walking distance.

Host Site Description

Schedule: March - October

The campground host site is #44. This back-in only site is 57-ft long and 15-ft wide. It features sewer hookup, a fire ring, grill, picnic table, Wi-Fi, water hookup and 110, 30 and 50 amp electrical access.

Campsite 44 is in a partially shaded area on the upper hillside in the campground. The site is level with easy access to either the upper or lower campground bathhouses.

Responsibilities

- Camper Orientation & Information: answer questions about the park, its rules, history, facilities, and provide with local brochures
- Light Maintenance: inspect, restock and lightly clean all campground restrooms and campground area
- Patrol Campground: minimum once per shift and report any inappropriate activity
- Camper Registration: register late arrivals paying with credit cards
- Maintenance-Duty Activities: four hours per week of additional maintenance, as designated by park staff. This include tasks such as mowing, trimming grass, removing litter, cleaning fire pits and grills, and cleaning shelters or restrooms.
