PARK DESCRIPTION

South Cumberland State Park is located within four different Tennessee counties: Grundy, Franklin, Marion and Sequatchie. The park is composed of approximately 30,845 acres in nine separate areas and boasts some of the best hiking, backcountry camping, and rock climbing in the region. Visitors can see spectacular rock formations, cascading streams, waterfalls, rocky gorges, panoramic overlooks, and lush woodlands.

HOSTING DESCRIPTION

Campground Description

Foster Falls Campground

- Campground is located off of hwy 41 southeast of Tracy City in the southern section of the park. Situated at the trail head of the popular Fiery Gizzard trail system and Foster Falls overlook and trail.
- The Foster Falls campground has 25 rustic campsites ideal for tents or small trailers. This is the only camping area in the park where guests may park a car and/or pop-ups next to the campsite. The campground is open year-round. All sites have a fire ring and a picnic table. Most sites are wooded, offering some shade and have a level, gravel surface. There are no water or electric hook-ups but a restroom and heated showers are available. No gas generators are allowed.

Host Site Description

Schedule: Year-Round

- Host site is the first place a visitor will see when entering the area and located on your right, by itself, just outside of the Foster Falls Campground. The host site is placed up on top of the hill within view of the campground entrance, Foster Falls Trail head, and Foster Falls day use area, but still offers some privacy. A dumpster, storage shed and an ATV are available for the host(s) to use.
- Driveway is a combination of gravel and pavement (extra parking available)
- Host site has water, sewer, 50 amps, and Wifi

Responsibilities

- Clean & tidy up Trail Restroom & Campground Bathhouse
- Campground kept tidy; including daily trash pick up & removal
- Point of contact for day visitors & overnight campers and assisting in registering camp sites (Visitor Center & Ranger Station are located 17 miles away)
- Notifying park staff of problems observed and or emergencies as they arise (able to give accurate trail descriptions and locations)
